Re: Start of COVID-19 vaccination campaign for children aged 5 to 11 years

Hello,

We are reaching a pivotal stage in the fight against COVID-19. Vaccination for children aged 5 to 11 years will begin soon. As of November 24, 2021, the vaccine will be offered in many big vaccination clinics. We invite you to book an appointment for your child right way!

To allow children aged 5 to 11 to be vaccinated, parental consent is required. Your presence as parent during the vaccination of your child at the clinic will serve as consent. When vaccinating your child, you should bring with you:

- its health insurance card (RAMQ), if available,
- its immunization record, if available.

AT SCHOOL

Dates will be reserved in our vaccination clinics for schools wishing to organize a bus service to bring their students there. Your child's school will let you know the date, if applicable. Please indicate your consent or refusal by returning the attached form to your school as soon as possible, by November 30.

To receive their vaccine, your child will need:

- the attached consent form <u>signed by one of the parents</u> (mandatory)
- its health insurance card (RAMQ), if available
- its immunization record, if available

THE VACCINE IS EFFECTIVE AND SAFE FOR 5- TO 11-YEAR OLDS.

As parents, we want what is best for our kids, and it's normal to feel a bit hesitant about getting them vaccinated. We want to reassure you that the COVID-19 vaccine is very effective in this age group and very safe. Before being authorized for use in Québec, the vaccine was carefully evaluated and very large-scale high-quality studies were conducted. Here are a few important elements to consider:

- COVID-19 can have serious, long-lasting consequences such as memory loss, respiratory problems and fatigue, even in children. The vaccine offers very effective protection against this illness.
- By protecting our kids, we also protect adults around them, yourself as parent, and grand-parents, who are more vulnerable. Everyone is better protected.
- Giving children aged 5 to 11 years two doses of vaccine greatly reduces the spread of the virus in our communities. Then all social and school activities can finally return to normal.
- The vaccine is free and accessible to everyone, even people who don't have health insurance cards.
